TRAFFIC PATTERNS

Thank you for your efforts in regard to the following: We continue to work diligently to insure the safety of all of our students and school families and staff. Parents and others who bring students to school in the morning are asked to observe the following:

- Please pull up in front of the school as close as possible to the flag pole. This enables a number of cars to unload students at the same time, and allows for a steady flow of exiting vehicles, including school busses.
- As a safety factor, please have your student exit on the school side of your vehicle rather than the traffic side.
- The bus drivers have been asked to allow students to exit the bus as close to the entrance as possible. This can happen if there is a steady flow of vehicles.
- If you need to come into the building, please park your car in one of the designated spaces along the hillside.
- Please do not drop off students before 8:00 a.m. as there is no one to supervise them until that time.

If you exit your vehicle at any time, please do not leave it running.

Thank you for your consideration of the above which provide the highest measure of safety possible for everyone on our campus!
